Results

I. Build infrastructure

1. Build 4 strategic facilities throughout the metropolitan area.
2. The facility will be constructed in military “base” or “village” type format.
3. The material will be either tent, barracks, or individual village style.
4. They will have the following building categories:
 - Living quarters
 - Will have common shower with private stalls
 - Will have common bathroom with private Stalls
 - Will have access to electric plug-ins
 - All living quarters will be private
 - Common Mess Hall
 - Common Medical Facility
 - Job placement and office
 - Separate areas for family, general, and high risk.
5. All facilities will be climate controlled with full power and sewer.
6. Bus service will pick from inside the property. No loitering outside:

II. Set up services

1. The facilities will provide the following:
 - Clean Facilities Room and board
 - Clean Restroom Facilities
 - Food – Clothing
 - Transportation
 - Security –Onsite
 - Storage of belongings
 - Transition Services and Income Ability including:
 - Job training and placement
 - Daily work
 - Encourage Entrepreneurship and Full support
 - Support getting back into mainstream society
 - Continued support in productive behavior
 - Full Medical facilities including doctors on site.
 - Full Counseling and services in:
 - Drug an alcohol problems
 - Domestic Problems
 - Provide support for difficult transition problems
 - People with all disabilities
 - Mental illness
 - Just difficult situations
2. Any further needed service will be added on a case-by-case basis.



III. Triage and pick-up

1. Every Homeless person is identified.
2. A public/private synergy is created to pick up all homeless.
 - Duration timeline is 1 week or less
3. Every person is triaged to determine needs and placement.
 - They will shower, get food, change clothing, receive medical, and get cleaned up
 - Weapons are not permitted
 - Drugs are not permitted
 - Alcohol is not permitted
4. From triage person is assigned quarters and personal storage.
 - Personal hygiene will be maintained
5. Next day person is issued the following:
 - Food Card – Also used at the camp
 - Unemployment of \$100.00 @ week also used in camp/rent
 - Medical ins is established
 - Some basic rules of social interaction requirements
6. Any person not conforming will be handled on case-by-case basis.
7. People will not be required to leave facility especially in the heat of the day.



IV. Period of Adjustment

Social Norms and behaviors will eventually normalize. It is important to note that this camp cannot become a concentration camp. The people are to be treated with respect as adults. Further they are Americans and have their rights. **The camp environment should reflect an atmosphere of human kindness and support for people who are not coping due to their situation. Never forget their situation can and will improve.**

V. Work towards changing laws and practices to prevent homelessness.

1. Work towards a simpler DES system.
2. Work towards one ins for people in need (including everybody)
3. **Work towards one number to call for financial help and homeless (211).**
4. Have operators always available.
5. Work to lower medical costs (including everybody)
6. Combine outreach resources therefore cutting costs.
7. Work towards having nobody ever need this service.

V. Advantages

1. People business risk taker can have safety net..
 - Would encourage economy
2. More monies could be available to build businesses.
3. Eliminate Homeless permanently.
4. Provide support for transition back to society.
5. Reduce current costs by millions ++
6. Reduce current infrastructure needed.
